LOGLINE

Inspired by a lot of people's true stories...

An African American mother, convicted and on the verge of prison, asks for one last chance to see her kids. But when her children refuse to say goodbye, she's forced to make other plans.

SHORT SYNOPSIS

Shayna stands before the judge in family court, a defeated woman on the brink of losing everything she holds dear. Today is the day she will sign her Termination of Parental Rights, a death sentence for her motherhood. She's heading to prison and will most likely never lay eyes on her children again. But before the ink dries on that fateful document, she pleads with the court officer to grant her one last request, to see her children, LaShonda, Deon, and Corey, one final time, to apologize for her mistakes and say goodbye in person. The officer, her heart hardened by many years working in the system, relents, but only for a mere five minutes.

LONG SYNOPSIS

Shayna stands before the judge in family court, a defeated woman on the brink of losing everything she holds dear. Today is the day she will sign her Termination of Parental Rights, a death sentence for her motherhood.

She's heading to prison and will most likely never lay eyes on her children again. But before the ink dries on that fateful document, she pleads with the court officer to grant her one last request, to see her children, LaShonda, Deon, and Corey, one final time, to apologize for her mistakes and say goodbye in person. The officer, her heart hardened by many years working in the system, relents, but only for a mere five minutes.

But her children refuse to say goodbye. They believe that if they say goodbye to their mother, it will be forever. They plan to escape the courthouse, to run away from the pain and heartache. And Shayna, desperate for one last chance to be with her family, goes along with their plan, willing to risk everything for a moment of grace.

In that small window of time, Shayna is forced to confront the weight of her actions, the devastation she has wrought upon her children, and the overwhelming love that still burns within her family. She is a woman who has fallen from grace, but in this moment, she is given a chance to rise again, to fight for redemption, and to prove that even in the darkest of circumstances, the human spirit can still triumph.



DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

I aim to capture the enduring strength of black families on film, inviting the world to witness their resilience and celebrate their stories. NEVER CAN SAY GOODBYE is a narrative of determination, showcasing a family's unwavering commitment to unity. It's a testament to the fight for self-expression and autonomy.

For Black and Brown parents entangled in the Child Protective Services system in the U.S., the experience is marked by the harsh scrutiny of their skin color. The process is mired in bureaucracy: overwhelmed agencies, a fragmented legal system, and a family court system often skewed in judgment. Once ensnared, escape is a formidable challenge. The parents I've interviewed in my research call it institutional racism.

NEVER CAN SAY GOODBYE invites you to intimately grasp this issue. I am confident that you will discern why one family's resolve to push back is, in essence, an act of genuine heroism resonating with families everywhere."



DIRECTOR, Chris Grant

Chris Grant is a filmmaker based in New York City for the past 16 years. After attending NYU Grad film, his short films won numerous festival awards including screenings in the Showtime Black Filmmaker's Showcase, The Clark Atlanta Festival, and The Mill Valley Film Festival.

During a prolific career in television marketing, Chris was proud to become the first African American Creative Director for two of the Discovery Channel Networks - Destination America and The American Heroes Channel.

He has received multiple New York Foundation for the Arts grants for improvisational acting and directing. Never Can Say Goodbye was created via workshop using non-actors to create inform the storytelling.

Chris tells stories of the African American experience finding hope, addressing themes of justice, transformation, and complex family dynamics. He hopes to direct The Sugar Hill Express, a 2018 Sundance Labs script, as his debut feature film.



Noah Molinari as Corey Nadal



THE BACKGROUND CAST

The wonderful background cast of Never Can Say Goodbye were the most important members of the production.

They are all parents who have dealt with the ongoing trauma of child parent separation. By courageously coming forward to be heard, they are helping to spread the word that there is hope for every parent dealing with this problem.

Never Can Say Goodbye was created for and inspired by these brave families.

NEVER CAN SAY GOODBYE - The Workshop

Never Can Say Goodbye incorporates a dedicated social justice initiative, employing drama therapy as a pivotal element in the production process.

Drama therapy leverages theatrical techniques to attain therapeutic objectives, encompassing symptom alleviation, emotional and physical integration, and personal development. It proves particularly beneficial for individuals grappling with the strain and stigma of parent-child separation.

In our three-day workshop, parents are afforded the opportunity to narrate their own experiences within a secure and inclusive community. The overarching emphasis is on the imperative of being heard.



NEVER CAN SAY GOODBYE - Ten Things to Know

- Unconventional Filming Location: The entire film was shot in the Bronx Courthouse, Bronx, New York. This
 deliberate choice reflects the reality that the majority of those affected by CPS interactions reside in this New York
 borough.
- 2. Colorization: The colorization process serves to depict the profound impact of losing one's children on a mother's essence. When Shayna is near her children, vibrant colors emerge. In her absence, she appears in black and white, symbolizing the draining of her life force.
- Authentic Casting: The Family Court lobby is filled with parents who have experienced child/parent separation.
 Their authentic experiences form the core voiceover motif of the film, reflecting their interactions with the Child
 Protective Services system.
- 4. Unique Production Challenges: The drama therapy workshop and film shoot were seamlessly integrated, with participants engaging in exercises on set. An entire day of shooting was dedicated to working with this group.
- Casting Choice: Crystal Lucas-Perry has demonstrated exceptional dedication to Never Can Say Goodbye.
 Originally attached in 2019, production was halted due to Covid. She returned immediately in 2023, recognizing the immense importance of the topic.
- 6. The Workshop: The 3-day Never Can Say Goodbye Drama Therapy Workshop is designed as a standalone component. The goal is to replicate it in 2024 to assist up to 150 parents across the country.
- 7. Inspirations: Never Can Say Goodbye is the result of extensive research into hundreds of stories from parents who have faced similar challenges with the family court system. This widespread issue often leaves affected individuals without an outlet for their pain.
- 8. Collaborations with Experts: The script was rigorously reviewed by parents, advocates, and lawyers immersed in these issues. Two of them even appear in the film: Martin Guggenheim (Judge) Head of Family Defense Clinic at NYU, and Michael Rooney (Lawyer) attorney with the Homicide Defense Task Force of The Legal Aid Society.
- Awards: The film received a 10k grant from the Sundance Development Labs and serves as a proof-of-concept for THE SUGAR HILL EXPRESS, a longer film on the same subject.
- 10. Hidden Detail: Keen observers will notice that the children are actually laughing in the one-shot scene at the Deli while Shayna is committing her crime.
